HOSA State Competition in WI Dells over Break

Congratulations to our Dodgeville High School HOSA (future healthcare professionals) members that attended this year's 2022-23 HOSA State Leadership Conference in Wisconsin Dells. Pictured are this year's attendees Jessica Adler, Chloe Johnson, Braylin Lathrop, and Kristina Vinger. HOSA is an international organization created for students with interests in science careers, especially the health sciences. It starts off each year with HOSA students selecting a science career that interests them, then throughout the first semester, they study college-level materials, practice career-related skills, write speeches, or create projects. In January, they compete regionally against other students from all across the state in their event. Four of our DHS HOSA students made that cut



for a chance to attend the state competition: Alyson Melssen in physical therapy, Chloe Johnson in sports medicine, Kristina Vinger in epidemiology, and Braylin Lathrop in medical assisting.

At the state-level competition held on April 2-4th, DHS HOSA came home with two top-ten finishers after competing against the best in the state. Congratulations go out to Braylin Lathrop coming in 6th place overall in medical assisting and Chloe Johnson coming in 9th place overall in sports medicine. This is not an easy achievement as most of the schools DHS participates against are larger schools with specific programs or classes in place related to many of these events, along with some high school students already attending college classes in their fields of study. Our students spend their own time studying and learning skills outside of their regular classes so they can compete in the career area that interests them. Nice work on representing Dodgeville High School.

In addition to the competition part of the conferences, HOSA students can serve as voting delegates and courtesy core members, participate in healthcare-related breakout sessions, and attend wellness activities. They have the opportunity to attend CPR, Stop the Bleed's FAST (First Aid for Severe Trauma) training, team building activities, and college and career fairs. Additionally, they also participate in the Anatomage competition using some of the latest technology related to anatomy and physiology.

Members also help in fundraising for Be the Match and the Children's Heart Foundation. For those that are curious, the Children's Heart Foundation was founded in 1996 and is the country's leading organization solely dedicated to funding congenital heart defect (CHD) research. Our annual DHS Healthy Heart Walk fundraiser helps support this research. And for the past 35 years, Be the Match has been operated by the National Marrow Donor Program which manages the most diverse marrow registry in the world. This program helps save lives through bone marrow and stem cell transplants. For the thousands of people diagnosed every year with life-threatening blood cancers like leukemia and lymphoma, this is their cure. You can make a difference – through bone marrow or stem cell donation, giving a financial gift, or volunteering – and turn the impossible into the achievable for a patient in need of a cure.
