Here would be a technique you could try to support your mind in being present and grounded in your work:


First, focus on your breathing. Practice 4 count belly breathing by breathing in, holding, exhaling, and holding (each being done to a count of 4) then repeat-

Second, focus on your senses (one at a time). Acknowledge each beginning with 5 things you see, 4 things you feel, 3 things you hear, 2 things you smell, and 1 thing you taste. If you can't remember the order it is okay to switch up the sense although tasting five things may provide a unique challenge.

Lastly I want to remind everyone that in March we will be having activities for all students on ACT day. Freshman and Sophomores will be touring an area college, Juniors taking the ACT, and Seniors having workshops on scholarships, graduation practice, and end of the year events. By the end of the month of March all students will have their courses selected for next year.

Key Club to Hold 3rd Blood Drive March 1st



Remember - if you donate or work during school hours you must have teacher permission (form). Teacher Permission slips are due back to Mrs. Kulcinski by the end of the day on Monday, Feb 27th.

HOSA Competition


