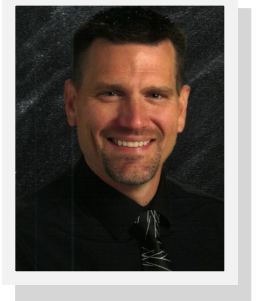

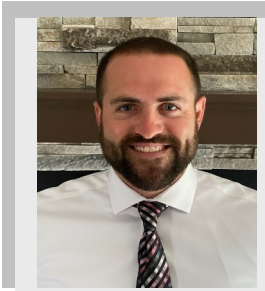

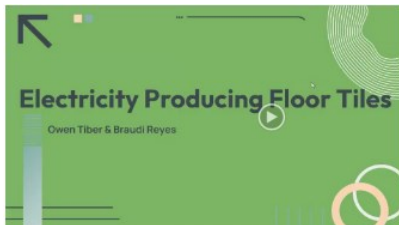

Friday, May 26th is seniors last day including the following activities:

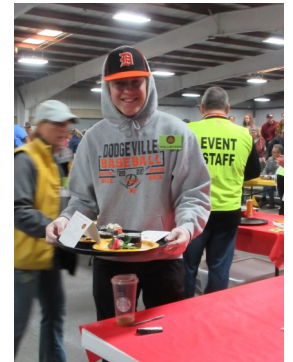
